The Minister for Agriculture, Food & the Marine in accordance with Section 24 of the Veterinary Medicinal Products, Medicated Feed and Fertilisers Regulation Act, 2023 grants an internet retail licence to:

1. This licence authorises the holder to retail via the website

www.mclaughlins.ie

veterinary medicinal products (VMPs) in accordance with national law. This Internet Retail Licence is subject to the above-mentioned legislation and the conditions specified in this licence.

2. Failure to comply with national and EU legislation and/or any condition of this licence may result in a sanction which may include revocation and/or prosecution.
3. The licence is valid from **15-04-2026** and unless previously suspended, revoked or varied shall remain in force while the following Licence No. **LM/CK/108** remains in force.

Schedule to Licence no: INT/CK/108

1. Only veterinary medicinal products designated with a route of sale of LR (Licensed Retailer) and CAM (Companion Animal Medicines), and antiparasitics designated as POM for food producing animals including equines may be sold under an internet retail licence, unless determined otherwise in national law.
2. In the circumstances that this licence is granted to a person registered as a Companion Animal Medicine Retailer the only veterinary medicinal products that are permitted to be sold are those with a route of supply of CAM.
3. Veterinary medicinal products not subject to a prescription may be sold across the European Union, provided they are authorised, as verified by the licensee, for use in the destination country.
4. Veterinary medicinal products subject to a prescription (if they are permitted to be sold in accordance with national law) may only be sold within the State. They may not, under any circumstance, be sold to another Member State or outside of European Union.
5. The location from which the internet site is controlled, where the contract will be concluded and the records maintained shall be a premises licensed for the retail sale of veterinary medicinal products and companion animal medicines, a veterinary practice supplying to their own clients or a pharmacy.
6. The common logo for internet retail is required to be displayed on every page of the website that sells or offers for supply veterinary medicinal products. The guidelines provided by the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine for the use of the common logo must be followed.
7. The contract of sale shall only be entered into (i.e., acceptance of the order) when the retailer, veterinarian or pharmacist is satisfied that the supply of a veterinary medicinal product is in order. A record of this process, which shall include the signature of the retail responsible person and the date shall form part of the record referred to in paragraph (11).
8. Each consignment of veterinary medicinal products dispatched shall be packaged securely and safely and shall be addressed to the purchaser identified on the order. In the case of veterinary medicinal products that require temperature control, the licensee shall ensure that the delivery system used shall guarantee that temperature parameters specified for the products in question are observed. A



documented risk assessment should be performed in these instances.

9. Each consignment of veterinary medicinal products with a route of retail of Licenced Retailer, or antiparasitics designated as POM require the purchaser to sign on receipt. Records of receipt of delivery should be retained by the holder of this licence.
10. The record-keeping requirements of Article 103(3) of EU 2019/6 in relation to an internet business shall apply to all categories of veterinary medicinal products sold.
11. Except for incoming stock records, separate records shall be maintained for all aspects of the internet business.
12. All records and documents relating to the internet business shall be retained for at least five years.
13. Access shall be afforded to authorised officers of the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine to the records and documents related to the internet business.
14. Any changes in the particulars supplied in support of the application shall be notified in writing to the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine and any proposed material changes affecting the operation of the business shall first be submitted to the said Department for approval.
15. If the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, has reasonable grounds to believe that the conditions applicable to a licence are not being observed, he/she may by a notice in writing, suspend a licence pending further investigation and if satisfied that the conditions applicable to a licence are contravened, may amend or revoke the licence.
16. In the case of internet retail to destinations outside the State, the holder of an internet retail licence shall only retail a veterinary medicinal product which is authorised for retail in this State, to a person who is lawfully permitted to receive the veterinary medicinal product, in accordance with the legislation of the destination country. Any specific enquiry about the status of a particular product which it is intended to retail to another country, or about rules applying to the retail of veterinary medicines in the destination country, should be addressed to the regulatory authority in the destination country.
